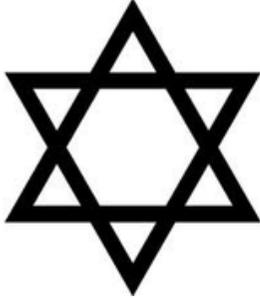

Religious Education

What I should already know

- Shema is the most important prayer for Jews to remind them that there is only one God. (Y2)
- Shabbat is a precious time for Jews to rest and remember that God created the world. (Y2)
- A synagogue is a building where Jewish people worship their God. (Y2)
- Yom Kippur is the holiest and most sacred day of the Jewish year. (Y4)
- Jewish children have bar/bat mitzvah at the age of 12 or 13 to show that they are a son or daughter of the Jewish commandments.

Orthodox Jews will keep kosher food laws strictly but Progressive Jews might not.
Progressive	Jews who reconcile their faith with modern life.		
Siddur	A Jewish prayer book that has a set order of a list of Jewish prayers and blessings.		
Kosher	The laws around the types of food that Jews can eat.		
Mitzvot	The 613 Jewish commandments found in the Torah that Jews must follow.
